

Noon Cobb Group History

Noon meetings began at the Cobb House on May 9, 1984, initially only on Fridays. They soon grew to daily meetings, Monday through Saturday, with Sunday meetings at 10. In 1987 a second meeting – closed, non-smoking -- was started across the hall. The noon meetings became the best attended at the Cobb House.

In 1995, the group conscience voted to split noon and night meetings, and Noon Cobb registered as a group on in April or May 1995. GSR was Patrick B., and Alternate GSR was Peter S. At that time, the Sunday meeting was held at 12:30. When Emmanuel Church sold the Cobb House in August 2007, Noon Cobb moved to Church of the Redeemer on Pulaski Street. By August 2008, they had moved a building owned by First United Methodist Church at 110 Hancock St., the corner of Hancock and Lumpkin Streets.

In 2013 both open and closed meetings are held Monday through Saturday at 12:10 p.m. Sunday meetings are at 1:30 p.m. Daily meeting attendance is 60 to 80 people.

The group has traditionally held a Thanksgiving potluck dinner every year after the noon meeting.
